Reporting to the Clinical Director, you will assume one of two positions as Clinical Supervisor with the North Region Autism Intervention Program. As an integral member of a dynamic team of experienced and well-trained professionals, you will be responsible for the development, monitoring, and evaluation of intensive behavioural intervention (IBI) programs for children with autism. You will also oversee quality assurance including the provision of staff training and evaluation and have opportunities to carry out applied research.

Clinical Supervisors must have a master's degree in behaviour analysis or psychology and certification with the Board of Certified Behaviour Analysts completed or in progress. Three years of senior experience in IBI along with advanced knowledge of autism, developmental disabilities, IBI, and clinical assessment tools are required. Your superior interpersonal skills are coupled with experience working as a member of a team.
